English: Reading, writing and speaking & listening skills based on the book – Charlie and the Chocolate factory. English will be embedded into the trips out in the Community. Working specifically to the student's individual levels, from phonics, colourful semantics to constructing simple sentences independently.

SALT (Speech and Language Therapy) This term SALT will be doing bucket time with F1 students and working on colourful semantics/grammar/expressive language with the F2 students. The children are having 1:1 assessment, which will then enable the SALT team to put bespoke planning in for the rest of the academic year.

<u>Food Tech</u> Pupils will learn the basics of food hygiene and safety in the kitchen. They will learn how to prepare healthy snacks. They will also learn to understand ingredients and food culture of different countries.

<u>Learning for Life</u> In Learning 4 life this term our students will be identifying their own skills, talents, and personal qualities and to recognise those of others.

<u>Daily Living Skills</u> Students will be learning how to keep safe in the home and garden. They will be working towards Asdan – preparing simple drinks and snacks.

<u>Preparing for Adulthood</u> This term working on own strengths, likes and ability to make own decisions and choices. Thinking about the future.

<u>Science</u> Through exciting experiments and activities, our students will be learning all about famous inventors, including the Wright brothers, Alexander Bell and Thomas Edison.

<u>ICT</u> Pupils will be learning to access schools computers and the internet, learning to log themselves on. They will learn about the fundamentals of ICT. They will engage with Microsoft Word and PowerPoint.

Stony Dean School Foundation - FNI & FN2 Autumn Term 1 Curriculum

World around us Students will understand how Christmas and Eid al-Fitr are celebrated. They will focus on the religious and social aspects of each festival and the importance of them to the communities they take place in.

Leisure and Recreation Sessions delivered from Sports for All. The emphasis this term will be around social skills and positive interactions with their peers. Our students will also be able to develop their independence and social skills through activities at Chiltern open air museum, the Riverside trust and Rogue bowling.

<u>PE - PE</u> lessons are focussing on their Fundamental - movement skills this term. Activities include sensory circuits, football training by an external coach and use of the school gym.

<u>Maths</u>: We have been completing baseline assessment and will starting with working on Addition and subtraction, number bonds, Place Value, Locate these numbers on a number line. Represent and solve simple addition problems using a range of strategies including counting on, partitioning and rearranging. We will be working on using money in the Community.

<u>Horticulture:</u> This term we will be learning about safety in the garden, seasonal jobs in the garden. Planting bulbs and seeds and understanding the process of growth.

<u>Community Skills:</u> We will be Learning about facilities in our local community. Visits to supermarket, shops, parks, leisure centre, museums. Embedding English, Maths and Communications skills.

Art The focus this term is exploring colour and texture. Making a colour wheel, colour book. They will be learning about art throughout the ages, past, present and future. From Cave drawings to modern art, gaining an understanding of famous artists and styles from past to present.

Music & Performing Arts Music: Students will focus on the topic of past, present – looking at music and instruments throughout the ages. Music and songs from Charlie and the Chocolate factory. Performing Arts: Focusing on expressions and body language, acting and miming. Working on our Book of the term – Charlie and the Chocolate factory.

EHCP: Bespoke sessions around EHCPs. Understanding the importance of individual annual reviews, and making scrapbooks to support their ideas and choices. These could be taken to Annual review meetings.
