The topic this term will be 'Power'. Students will study a book linked to this genre to support higher level reading, writing and speaking skills. Texts may include The Hunger Games, Animal Farm & An Inspector Calls.

Students will also begin to develop skills for one of the following qualifications.

## Learning for Life

Self-Awareness: Future career options through SMART targets and research. Pupils personal strengths, skills and qualities linking to career aspirations. Creating and understanding what a CV is and information needed to complete and apply for jobs.

Self-Care & Support: Pupils will learn about independent living, problem solving and support networks available in the community.

## SALT (Speech and Language Therapist Sessions)

Group project: Pupils will undertake in an advertisement filming project where they will be assigned roles (illustrator, director, scriptwriter, actors, and camera person). Pupils will research suitable products, learn about advertising techniques of persuasion and film a short video. Pupils will be supported to work on a range of targets: communication, participation, negotiation and compromise during the filming project.

## Science

Entry Level Physics – this includes energy types, conductors and insulators, what materials are best to insulate your hot drinks and home. Also, the different types of radiation. Completion of any outstanding coursework or tests for ELC.

**ICT** - Pupils in Year 11 will continue to prepare for a Level 3 certification in Digital Literacy Skills, underwritten by the British Computer Society. This qualification will look at using online forms, researching and storing information, creating and formatting a variety of files and documents and how to keep computing devices secure. Pupils must complete and pass two web-based exams to be accredited.

## Stony Dean School

## Year 11

**Humanities** - Pupils will learn about the Ethics of Food Production and the consumer. Students will learn how transportation of food takes place at both UK and global scales, the environmental consequences, advantages and disadvantages for the consumer of food outside and inside the UK, and how ethical retailing can help to reduce negative impacts on the environment.

**RE** – Students will begin the term looking at religion, community cohesion, racial harmony and gender equality. Pupils will begin a module on the key beliefs within Judaism. They will discover what it means to be Jewish, explore free will and the Mitzvot as well as, Jewish Key Moral Principles. Studies this term, will include Jewish historical events.

**PE** - Outside activities including: walking, football and orienteering.

Inside activities including: Sensory circuits, bench ball, basketball and trampolining. All lessons will include time in the inside gym.

## Maths

Most students focus on completing a maths qualification.

**Maths Entry Level Certificate** provides basic and relevant mathematical skills. It demonstrates confidence in maths. The exams cover practical information for the following topics: Number and Calculation; Money; Time and Calendar; Measures; Statistics; Fractions; and Geometry.

**Functional Skills Maths** qualifications explores real life mathematical contexts. Everyday mathematics forms the basis the specification. The topics covered are use of number and the number system; use of measures, shape and space; and handling information and data.

## Art and Technology Rotation – Carousel Choices and Lifeskills

**Resistant Materials** – In Year 11 students are introduced to manufactured boards i.e. plywood and use them in order to create a passive speaker project. They will revise the use of various skills and equipment and how to alter these techniques on different materials.

**Art**- Pupils in year 10 and 11 will be following the Arts Award bronze accreditation. Year 11 will be making sculptures in a variety of materials and techniques. They will also be making making an art instructional video or PowerPoint of their choice, as well as going to an art exhibition.

**Food Tech** - Pupils in Year 10 and 11 life skills will be cooking every lesson. This lesson is about getting pupils ready and confident to live independently. Pupils will plan, create, cook and evaluate dishes. We expect all pupils to try new things and participate in the theory as well as the practical based content.

**Creative arts** - KS4 will work towards their Arts Award Bronze qualifications through developing class led projects. This will require pupils to apply previous skills, including art and music. They can choose which skills to make a focus for
